

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


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## FROM THE **EDITOR'S DESK**



# THE BIRTH OF THE DRUM



As the "keeper of the rhythm," the drum provides the foundation for the overall sound of music. Because a drum only has to be hit to make a sound, it is also one of the simplest of the instruments.

#### IS YOUR BODY THE ORIGINAL PERCUSSION INSTRUMENT?

Beating on things to produce a sound, and through that sound express various emotions, is said to have begun in the early stages of human development, where people stomped on the ground or beat their own bodies.

Producing sounds by beating things served not just as accompaniment to dancing but also as a means of communicating with other people over long distances. It has also been used effectively to move the hearts and minds of people, such as in religious ceremonies. A wide variety of percussion instruments were created for these different purposes, and they have been developed and improved over the years.

#### THE DRUM KIT WAS BORN AT THE END OF THE NINETEENTH CENTURY

At the end of the nineteenth century, the snare drum, bass drum, cymbals, and other percussion instruments were first gathered into a "drum kit" that could be played by one person. The man attributed with starting this evolution is said to be a snare drummer named Dee Dee Chandler. Chandler became popular when he devised a way to play the bass drum by stepping on a pedal with his right foot, while at the same time playing the snare drum. Rhythm sections up to that point were made up of several people, but with Chandler's idea, this number could be reduced, which, in the end, was an incredibly important development.

#### THE EVOLUTION OF THE FOOT PEDAL

Spare bicycle parts find a new use

In the early days of the foot pedal, there was one type in which the beater was attached to the top of the bass drum rim (the frame that attaches the skin of the drum, called the head, to the body, called the shell), and another type in which the beater was attached to the bottom of the rim, as they are in today's drum kits. The pedals were made of wood and were not spring loaded, so the beater had to be returned to the ready position using the foot. The spring return mechanism of today's pedals was introduced in 1910. In 1934, ball bearings were added to create a smoother pedal action, and in 1950, the spring was built into the frame, improving the look and allowing for finer adjustment of the foot pedal, improvements that many drummers supported.

The next big improvement was the chain-driven pedal. Near the end of the 1970s, a craftsman at a drum store in New York removed the pedal's drive mechanism and replaced it with gears and a chain taken from a bicycle. Prior to that, there were pedals with metal parts connecting the drive mechanism, and those that used a belt made of nylon or other material. The former were said to have a "quick response," while the latter were said to have a little "play" in them. The chain drive combined the best appects of these two approaches to create a robust pedal that quickly gained wide acceptance.

#### THE FIRST HI-HAT LOOKED LIKE A SNOWSHOE

The hi-hat taps out 8-beat and 16-beat rhythms clearly, and sets the rhythm of music along with the snare drum and bass drum. However, the emergence of the hi-hat is surprisingly recent, and the hi-hat as we know it today was invented around 1930.

The original hi-hat consisted of two small cymbals' attached to two boards, one on top of the other, joined with a hinge. The upper board was attached to the foot with a strap like a sandal, which made it look like a snowshoe, and thus it was called "the snowshoe." When famous jazz drummer Baby Dodds was playing on Mississippi riverboat, he tapped the floor with his left foot in tempo with the music; and seeing this, an enthusiastic fan fashioned a device that enabled him to clash two cymbals together using a foot pedal, which is said to be the beginning of the development of the hi-hat.

### THE UKULELE

The Ukulele, a funky little instrument that resembles the classical guitar, is a universally popular instrument and it gives music lovers a fine way to enjoy music anywhere anytime. The ukulele descended from an instrument, called a machete, brought to Hawaii Island by sailors from Portugal. One may have known that the Ukulele means "jumping flea" in Hawaiian. However, the last queen of the Kingdom of Hawaii, Liliuokalani, translated ukulele as "gift from afar".

There are four (4) sizes of the ukulele, with the Soprano being the standard size. Other sizes include: Concert, Tenor and Baritone. Unlike the Guitar instrument, the Ukulele only has four (4) strings and are known by these notes: G-C-E and A.



## THE STORY OF THE PIANO'S INVENTION

The piano is a keyboard instrument that produces sound by striking strings with hammers, characterized by its large range and ability to play chords freely. It is a musical instrument that has broad appeal

#### THE PIANO'S ANCESTOR WAS A MONOCHORD INSTRUMENT

Instruments can be divided into three categories based on how they produce sounds. Those categories are string instruments, wind instruments, and percussion instruments. The piano's ancestry can be traced back through various instruments such as the clavichord, harpsichord, and dulcimer. But if it were traced back even further, one would find that the piano is a descendant of the monochord. In other words, based on its ancestry the piano can be classified as a string instrument.



#### THE PIANO HAS THE SAME MECHANISM AS THE DULCIMER

Although the piano can be classified as a string instrument due to the fact that the sounds come from the vibration of strings, it can also be classified as a percussion instrument because a hammer strikes those strings. In this way it is similar to a dulcimer.

The dulcimer is an instrument that originated in the Middle East and spread to Europe in the 11th century. It features a simple resonating box with strings stretched on top of it. Much like a piano, a small hammer is used to hit the strings, which is why the dulcimer is considered to be a direct ancestor of the piano.
